

PODARCIS ERHARDII (Erhard's Wall Lizard). GREECE: Pori and Lagouvardos islets south of Peloponnese ($35^{\circ}58'E$, $23^{\circ}14'N$ and $35^{\circ}58'E$, $23^{\circ}12'N$, respectively). 20 January 1992. E. D. Valakos, P. Maragou, and M. Mylonas. Verified by B. Chondropoulos. Museum of Natural History, University of Crete, Greece, MNHUC E1–E15 (Pori) and MNHUC E43–E44 (Lagouvardos). First records of the species for both islands. Although the commonest lizard in the Aegean, this species is absent from the surrounding areas of South Peloponnese and the neighboring bigger islands of Kithira and Antikithira (Gruber 1986, *Handbuch der Reptilien und Amphibien Europas*, W. Boehme (ed.), AULA-Verlag Wiebaden).
